Progress in Wales

When the Development Officer came in to post 18 months ago there were 19 member Trusts in Wales. We now have 24 Trusts who are APT members, and a further 5 who are likely to become Building Preservation Trusts in the next 6 months. Currently, there are another 5 Trust not included in the above figures who have constituted as Trusts but have not yet become members of APT. Including the support provided to potential, new and existing Trusts, the Development Officer has an active case load of 39 projects.

The Historic Environment of Wales
